Dollar General Literacy Grant brings almost \$127K to District

Dollar General Literacy Foundation has awarded Zanesville City Schools with a Youth Literacy Grant of \$126,990. This is the fourth consecutive the company's foundation has provided a grant to our District.

Dollar General initiated its literacy program in 1993 to honor company co-founder J.L. Turner, who was never formally educated and was considered functionally illiterate.

Dollar General Literacy Foundation awards funds to



applying organizations that are located within 20 miles of a Dollar General store or distribution center. It also funds grants for summer, family, and adult literacy programs.

Our District will implement use of the grant through our Teen Trendsetters peer-mentoring program, a collaborative effort between ZHS and our three elementary schools.



The ZHS Language Travel Group traveled to Spain, France, and Italy over the summer. The group travels every two years, and is currently putting together another fun-filled adventure. Our students were able to use their language skills in Spanish and French in an authentic setting, and have a conversation with natives of Spain and France. Even Ms. Porter learned a few new words! 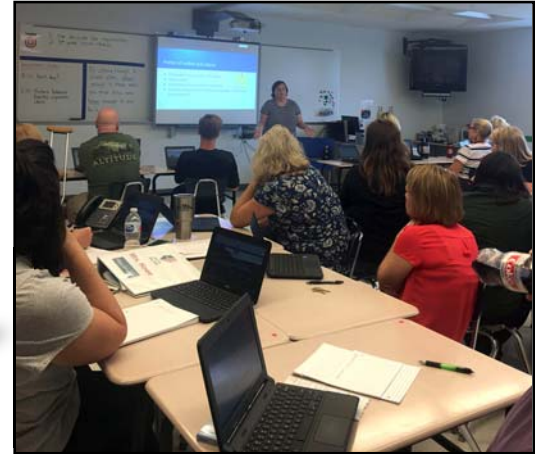
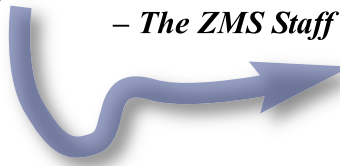
