The Ohio Transfer Module is a set of courses that generally satisfy a subset or entire set of general education requirements at all Ohio public 2 and 4 year colleges and universities. The courses represent a body of knowledge and academic skills containing between 36 - 40 semester hours of course credit in the following fields of English, Mathematics, Arts/Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences, Natural Sciences.

The following 15 hour Pathway contains courses that satisfy at least one section each of the OTM subject areas and Ohio University degree requirements.
