The head reserve coach must be a positive person. He/she must be willing and able to work long hours. He/she must have imagination, foresight and the ability to mold the uncoordinated and undisciplined into a strong, self-functioning unit that will persevere. His/her conduct and character must be above reproach, as his/her daily association has an immeasurable influence on the youth of the community. The head reserve coach in the Zanesville City School system must have a commitment to excellence in his/her work with the youth of our community. His/her responsibility and position, although awesome in scope, might just be one of the most rewarding and fulfilling of any, as the qualities he instills will live on forever.

REQUIRED SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Communication Skills: Must be able to read, analyze, and interpret information relevant to the position, including being able to speak effectively to small and large groups of people, and to communicate clearly and concisely both orally and in writing.
- Leadership Ability: Must be able to articulate a vision and mission for the district and provide the appropriate direction, guidance, and management skills to achieve them.
- Mathematics Skills: Must have the ability to work with basic mathematical and computational concepts.
- Reasoning Ability: Must be able to define problems, collect data, establish facts, and draw valid conclusions.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. To be loyal to the head baseball coach and to the entire Zanesville City Schools Athletic Program.
- 2. To follow the dictates of the head coach in the teaching of fundamentals of baseball.
- 3. Aid head coach in issuing and collecting baseball equipment.
- 4. Teach fundamentals and basic techniques of baseball.
- 5. Teach team pride and the will to win.
- 6. Assist head coach in the planning end of season banquet and include reserve team in plans.
- 7. To notify media regarding pre and post-game information and other publicity.
- 8. To help make necessary arrangements for the specific baseball field being used.
- 9. To attend clinics recommended by Athletic Director.
- 10. To abide by rules of OHSAA.
- 11. Offensive strategy First Base Coach
 - a. Move base runners around.
 - b. Relay signs to the batter.
 - c. Talk and instill spirit.
 - d. Check for opponents weaknesses.
- 12. Coach pitchers and catchers on the fundamentals and strategy of fielding, bunting, holding base runners, pick off plays, etc.
- 13. Keep scorebook and notify radio and newspaper of team results. Turn book in to Athletic Director at end
- 14. Final pitching and batting statistics to head coach.
- 15. Teach good sportsmanship by example.
- 16. Adhere to school districts philosophies and policies concerning coaches' conduct.
- 17. Complete administrative duties required before and after season.
- 18. Administer games and practices in a manner that student/athletes have a positive and fun learning experience.
- 19. Consult trainer and complete injury forms regarding any injury or disability.

- 20. Provide operator for field score board for home reserve games.
- 21. Attend appropriate Pupil Activity Supervision Validation class when required with CPR training.

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
