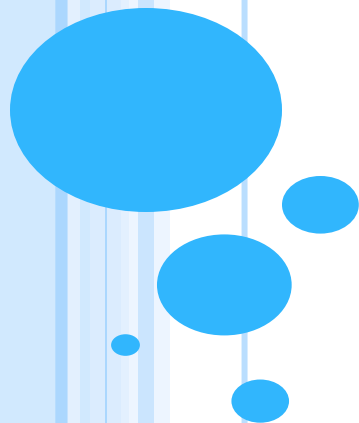

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS-PART 1

EARN 20 TOTAL CREDITS

Complete **4** credits of **ENGLISH**

Complete **4** credits of **MATH**

Complete **3** credits of **HISTORY**

Complete **3** credits of **SCIENCE**

Complete **1** credit of **FINE ARTS**

Complete **0.5** credits of **HEALTH**

Complete **0.5** credits of **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

(Or complete 2 seasons of a sport or marching band or 2 years of JROTC and submit 2 PE waivers to your counselor)

Complete the remaining credits in electives

OHIO'S STATE TESTS-GRAD REQUIREMENTS PART 2 FOR CURRENT % 2021-2022

You must meet one of the following standards:

1. Ohio's State Tests

- Students earn a CUMULATIVE 18 POINTS on the 7 end of course exams
 - End of course exams are given in: Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, American History, American Government, English 1 and English 2.
 - Students must earn a MINIMUM of 4 points in MATH, 4 points in ENGLISH and 6 points in SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUDIES to ensure well-roundedness.

2.) Industry Credential and Workforce Readiness

- Students earn 12 points through a State Board of Education-approved, industry-recognized credential or group of credentials in a single career field and achieve a workforce readiness score on the WorkKeys assessment. The state of Ohio will pay one time for those who take the WorkKeys assessment.



OHIO'S STATE TESTS-GRAD REQUIREMENTS PART 2

3.) College Admissions Test

- Students earn “remediation-free” scores in English language arts and mathematics on a nationally recognized college admission exam. The state of Ohio will pay one time for all 11th grade students in the classes of 2018 and beyond to take the exam free of charge.
 - Remediation free scores have been determined as follows*:
 - i.ACT: English: 18 or higher; Reading: 22 or higher; & Math: 22 or higher
 - ii.SAT: Reading: 450 or higher; Writing: 430 or higher; & Math 520 or higher

* scores DO NOT have to be met in one testing, as students may combine scores from different test administrations to meet the standard. Scores may NOT be combined between ACT and SAT, however, as all standards must be met through one test or the other.



OHIO'S STATE TESTS-GRAD REQUIREMENTS PART 2 FOR CURRENT % 2021-2023

You must show Competency AND Readiness

1. Competency

- Earn scores on end-of-course tests that demonstrate competency (competency determined by ODE by Spring 2020) in Algebra 1 and English 2.
- If competency not met by required scores on Algebra 1 and English 2, then students must meet one of the following:
 - **College Credit Plus:** Earn credit for one math and/or one English course through College Credit Plus.
 - **Career Experience & Technical Skill:** Complete two demonstrations, at least one of which must be foundational:
 - **Foundational:** Proficient on three WebXams, approved industry credential (12 points), pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an apprenticeship program
 - **Supporting:** Complete 250 hours of workplace experience, earn workforce readiness score on WorkKeys or the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal
 - **Military Readiness:** Meet the requirements to enlist in the military, as demonstrated by a contract with the military to enlist.

You must show Competency AND Readiness

2. Readiness

- **To demonstrate Preparation for College or Career**, students must earn two diploma seals, one of which must be state defined:
 - State Defined Seals:
 1. *OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal – Demonstrate professional skills*
 2. *Industry-Recognized Credential Seal – Earn 12 points worth of approved credentials*
 3. *College-Ready Seal – Score remediation-free on the ACT or SAT in Math and English*
 4. *Military Enlistment Seal – Participate in JROTC and/or enroll in the military*
 5. *Citizenship Seal – Score proficient on the American History and American Government tests*
 6. *Science Seal – Score proficient on the Biology test*
 7. *Honors Diploma Seal – Meet the requirements set by the State Board of Education*
 8. *Seal of Biliteracy – Demonstrate levels of proficiency in at least one other language*
 9. *Technology Seal– Complete advanced coursework in a technology field*
 - Locally Defined Seals:
 10. *Community Service Seal – Complete community service using locally-developed guidelines*
 11. *Fine and Performing Arts Seal – Demonstrate skills using locally-developed guidelines*
 12. *Certified Student Engagement Seal – Participate in meaningful activities such as athletics, clubs and student government as defined by locally-developed guidelines*

WHAT IS ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)?

- **A rigorous, nationally recognized curriculum** that offers students the opportunity to challenge themselves academically.
- **Ability to earn college credit** by completing AP courses and scoring a 3 or higher on the AP exams given at the end of the course.
- Deciding to take an AP course **shows colleges and universities that you have what it takes to succeed in an undergraduate environment.** When admissions officers see “AP” on your transcript, they know that what you experienced in a particular class has prepared you well for the challenges of college.
- Students should **carefully consider** their decision to enroll in AP courses based upon previous **courses taken, GPA, and maturity.** Prerequisite courses may apply to certain AP courses.
- **Benefits:** College Admissions; Financial; and Lifetime Skills

WHAT IS COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS? (CCP)

- CCP can help you **earn college and high school credits** at the same time by taking college courses from community colleges or universities.
- The purpose of this program is to **promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wide variety of options** to college-ready students.
- Students **MUST qualify** for CCP courses by obtaining a remediation free score on either the ACT, Write Placer or Accuplacer
 - The test will depend on the college to which students apply.
- Students **MUST turn in a Letter of Intent by April 1, 2020** to the Guidance Office if interested in participating in CCP for the 2020-21 Academic Year.

AP vs. CCP-WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

AP

AP exams are given in May and students must earn a 3 or higher to earn college credit *Credit awarded at all public universities in Ohio when a score of 3 or higher is obtained on the AP exam*

Credit awarded at private colleges & out of state colleges when a score of 3 or higher is obtained on the AP exam

No entrance exam to qualify for AP courses* *Students may have to meet specific course prerequisites and should consider maturity, academic performance and future goals*

CCP

Credit awarded at all public universities in Ohio* *Credits may be awarded as elective, rather than subject. Credit may be awarded at private colleges & out of state colleges*

A passing grade in the course yields credit Free to student if course taken at public university in Ohio

Students must earn a remediation free score on the university determined placement exam or ACT/SAT to participate



BENEFITS VS. POTENTIAL RISKS

Benefits

- Expands high school curriculum
- Academically challenging courses
- Gain college experience while in high school
- Assigned a college academic advisor
- Earn college credit while in high school
- Opportunity to work towards college degree, potentially requiring them to spend less time in college after high school graduation


Risks

- Impact on high school GPA and class standing
- Permanent college GPA
- Increased student responsibility for learning due to rigor of college coursework
- Conflicts between college and high school schedules
- Not all college credits earned will transfer to another college
- Possible financial obligations:
 - College credit earned while in high school counts towards the total allotment of course work a student may take in college and be eligible to receive federal financial aid.

CCP PROBATION & DISMISSAL

- **A student will be placed on CCP Probation if:**
 - They have a cumulative GPA below 2.0 in their college courses, or
 - They withdraw, or receive no credit for, 2 or more courses in the same term.
- **A student on CCP Probation:**
 - Must meet with high school counselor and parent/guardian to complete Probation paperwork.
 - May only enroll in 1 CCP course
 - This course CANNOT be in the same subject in which the student earned a grade below a D or for which the student received no credit.
 - Must request that the college dis-enroll the student from applicable courses.
 - Failure to notify the college can result in the student being financially responsible for payment for the course and all associated materials and fees.
 - Must raise their cumulative college GPA to a 2.0 or higher during the probationary semester to continue in CCP program.

CCP PROBATION & DISMISSAL, CONT.

- **A student will be dismissed from participating in CCP if:**
 - The student meets the definition of an underperforming student for 2 consecutive terms of enrollment.
 - He/She does NOT raise the cumulative college GPA above 2.0 during the probationary period.
 - **Results of CCP Dismissal:**
 - Student may not take any college courses through CCP
 - If previously registered for courses, the student must request that the college dis-enroll them from all courses.
 - Failure to notify the college can result in the student being financially responsible for payment for the course and all associated materials and fees.
